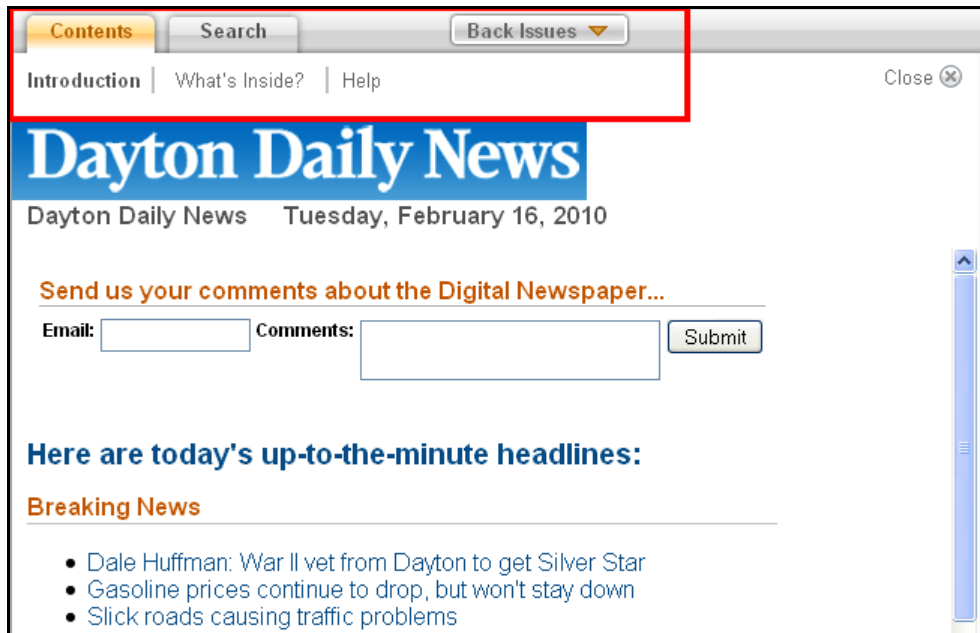


Learn more about the Digital Newspaper

Welcome to the Digital Newspaper Edition of the Dayton Daily News. This is going to change the way you read **your** local news.

Page by page, the Digital Newspaper Edition looks **just like** our printed newspaper – complete with all of the day’s articles, stories from our regular columnists, letters to the editor, in-paper ads, and special sections like Life and GO!



Getting Started

When you first open your newspaper online, you’ll see the front page of the newspaper and a table of contents with quick links to all of the articles in that day’s edition of the newspaper.

Contents

The contents tab includes links to the **Introduction**, **What’s Inside?** and **Help**.

Introduction

The Introduction tab includes a comment box so that you can send any comments you have about the Digital Newspaper edition.

What’s Inside?

“What’s Inside?” is where you go to access a **Table of Contents**, **Page Thumbnails**, and **Featured Pages**—so you can skip right to the information that interests you most!



Help

The Help link near the top of the window is another good reference. Here you'll find more information on the Reading and Searching features.

Search

Ever wish you could search the print newspaper for exactly what you were looking for? Now you can. To search, enter a keyword in the search box, and click the magnifying glass. When the search is complete, you get a list of any relevant stories that might contain your search term.

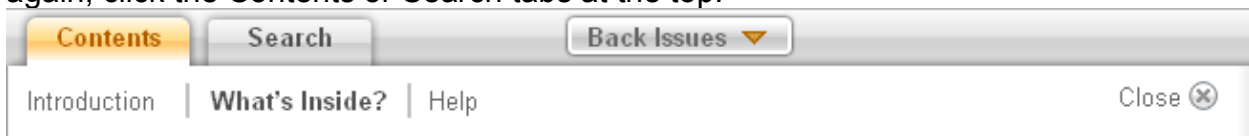
Back Issues

Within the e-edition, you will find links to the last two weeks editions of the newspaper. Click on the edition you would like to view. PLEASE NOTE: You will only have access to the back issues that you subscribe to. If you click on a newspaper edition that was distributed before you were a subscriber, the system will appear to be loading, but the edition will not load in your browser.



Expanding the Viewing Area

For a larger newspaper viewing area, close the left hand window. The newspaper pages will fill the entire screen. If you need to access information in the left hand navigation again, click the Contents or Search tabs at the top.



To view a story, photo or advertisement that interests you

Place your cursor over the item of interest in the full-page viewing mode. The you select item will be highlighted. Click once to zoom in and read the story, or double click to open the story in a new window and read the article in a simpler text-only format.

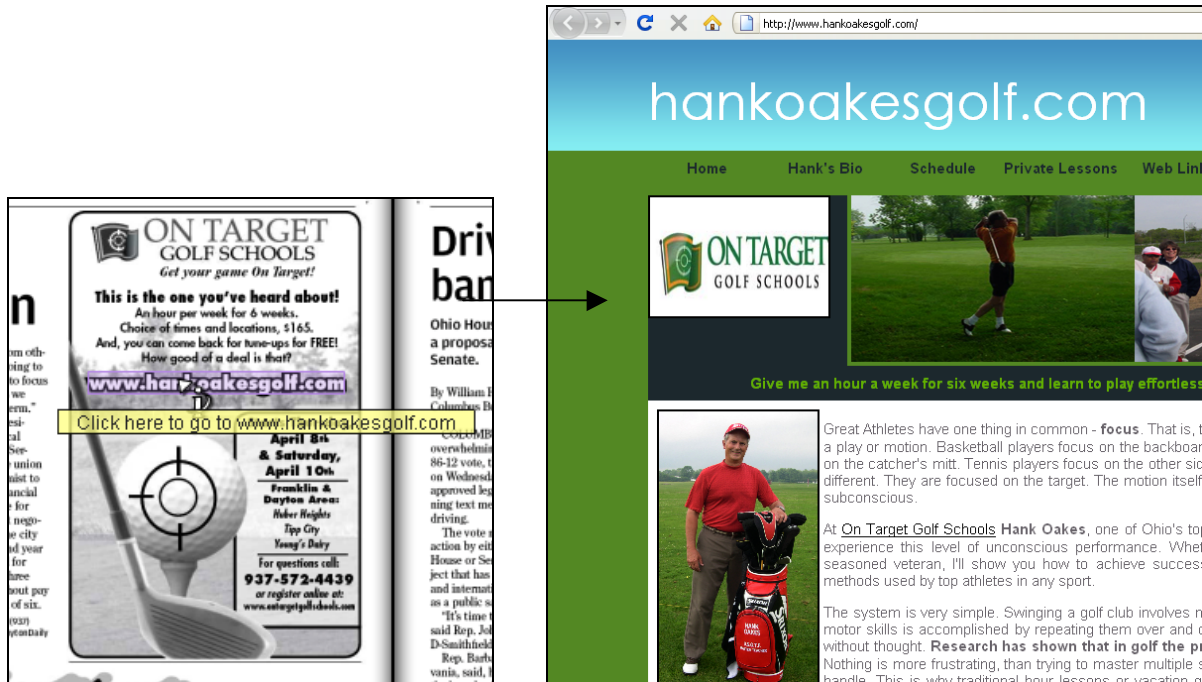
Navigating the Digital Newspaper Edition

You can also customize the way you read the newspaper with the two Page View Controls at the top of the page. Click the Single Page icon to see one page at a time, or the Double Page icon to open the newspaper and see two sheets at a time—just like your print newspaper!

To save an article, click the Floppy Disk Icon right next to the Printer Icon. You have the option to save the article as a PDF file, or bookmark the page in your browser.



Another advantage to the Digital Newspaper Edition is that you can click on links within the stories! When you click on a link for more information, the website will open in a new browser window.



The Digital Newspaper Edition looks just like the print newspaper, and contains all of the valuable information you expect. There's only one difference: We've moved the newspaper from your doorstep to your browser!
